

TIDINGS OF TRINITY

Adam and Eve sinned in the Garden of Eden. God also says you participated in that initial act of disobedience called "sin." Through St. Paul, God says: "just as through one man sin entered into the world, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men, *because all sinned.*" (Romans 5: 12) When God uses the phrase "*all sinned,*" He includes you!

Now, here is God's Good News for you! As soon as Satan tricked Adam, Eve — AND YOU — into disobeying God, and as soon as God saw that your sin had separated you from Him, He immediately began to re-establish His relationship with you. He arranged to redeem you, to buy you back. How? "Not with silver or gold, but with precious blood of Jesus Christ." Your heavenly Father arranged for His Son to crush the head of your adversary, the devil. and He also defeated the power of sin in your life.

Your heavenly Father's plan to rescue you from sin and death was completed when His Son Jesus cried out from the cross: "It is finished." The cross is God's power in your life. The message of God's cross assures you that all your sins are forgiven. Therefore, place a beautiful cross in your bedroom, or in your kitchen, or in your office, Or better yet, I encourage you to wear a cross. This cross will remind you of how your heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, completed His work for you. Look every day at the cross. It is God's medicine, the strength He gives you to fight the power of sin which tries to separate you from your Savior.

Live every hour with the assurance that Jesus Christ is fighting and subduing the power of sin, that still remains in you. "Greater is Jesus Who is in you than Satan who is in the world." (I John 4:4) Think of it this way. Every time you look at the cross, it reminds you that Christ's living word is "working still" within you. (John 5: 17) So I encourage each of you to put a cross where you can see it constantly. Even better, I encourage you to wear your cross wherever you go. This will be a constant reminder that Christ is always with you.

This is the Wedding picture of Alan and Travis Hoppes.

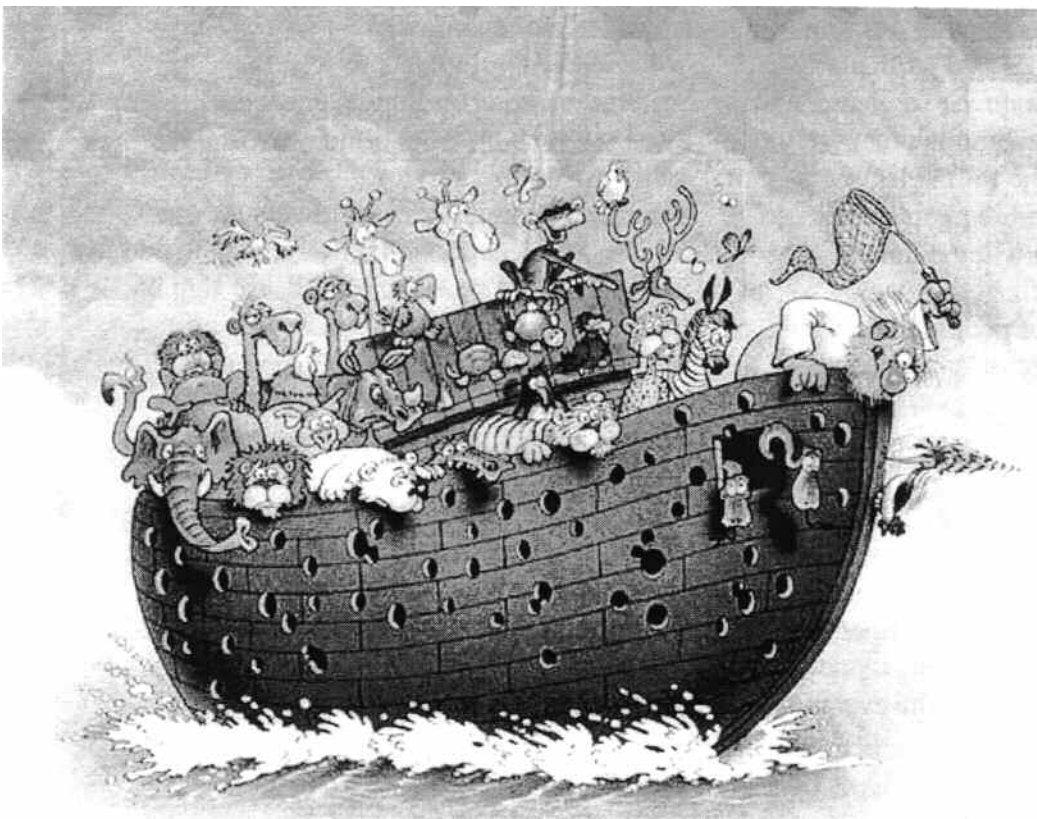
They were married July 12, 1964 in Odebolt, Iowa.
